# **Instruments suggested for World Music Drumming's Ensemble 1:**

High drum, medium drum, low drum, shakere ("rattle"), cow bell ("bell"), double bell

<u>Necessary Preparations:</u> When accompanying World Music Drumming's ensemble arrangements to pop tunes, my students have the best success if they can independently demonstrate all instrument rhythms of the ensemble pieces prior to playing in an accompaniment role. Students' ability to read conducting gesture is also important. After rehearing the various instrument rhythms, you can easily (and even spontaneously) build this arrangement by cueing/releasing the layers of instrumentation.

## *Verse 1 (16 measures) :33-:47*

- (m. 1-8) Using shell of drums,  $p \Vdash \downarrow \stackrel{?}{\downarrow} \stackrel{?}{$
- (m. 9-16) Enter mpShakere

## Chorus + Interlude (16 measures) :48-1:16

- (m. 1-8) Enter together f Cow Bell & f Low Drum question/High Drum answer
  - \*Drum shell **-** chorus section (m.1-8)
  - \*Retain fShakere
- (m. 9-16) Enter Double Bell
  - \* Retain f Cow Bell, f Shakere, & f Low/High Drums (m. 9-16)
  - \*Drum shell interlude section (m.9-16)

# Verse 2 (16 measures) 1:17-1:46

- (m. 9-16) Enter together pShakere & pMedium Drum

# Double Chorus (16 measures) 1:47-2:15

- (m. 1-16) Enter together f Cow Bell & f Low Drum question/High Drum answer

  \*Retain f Shakere & f Medium Drum (m. 1-16)
  - \*Drum shell This whole section (m. 1-16) and does not re-enter

# Interlude a cappella (8 measures) 2:16-2:30

- (m. 1-4) Entire ensemble
- (m. 5-8) pLow Drum question only

# Chorus a cappella (8 measures) 2:31-2:46

- (m. 1-8) Enter together pCow Bell & pMedium Drum
  - \*(m. 1-8) Low Drum question

#### Double Chorus (16 measures) 2:47-3:14

Cow bell, low/high drum, shakere, medium drum, & opt. double bell enter together on m. 1

- (m. 1-16) f Cow Bell & f Low Drum question/High Drum answer
  - \* fShakere & fMedium Drum
  - \*Optional Double Bell in this section

#### *Outro (8 measures) 3:15-3:30*

• (m. 1-8) Gradually fade out all instruments, layer by layer, to accommodate the abrupt ending.
