Musical Relays

I like to do these relays when the weather is super nice outside, and the kids just need to get out and burn off some energy.

- I. Gather supplies needed. I usually take a markerboard, eraser, and marker for each team. Then I also make sure to have whichever flash cards I may need. I also sometimes use poly dots to help the students find their teammates easier.
- 2. Outside have your students set up in teams with one person at the end with the marker board, and the rest on the other side facing you.



- 3. This is when you can decide what you want to review. Often, I will hold up a rhythm card, for all of the students to memorize, (I count to five) and then they run down to their markerboard friend, and they as a team have to notate the rhythm. This could be done with solfege, or vocabulary words, pretty much anything.
- 4. The person who wrote, then returns back to the team side, and the person who just ran stays and becomes the marker board writer, and repeat!
