Lesson Focus: Recorder Improvisation, low F practice Recommended Grade Level: 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup>, depending on when you introduce recorder Kate Konrad

- 1. When students are comfortable playing in F pentatonic, introduce "All Through the Night" from Carol King's <u>Recorder Routes</u> (page 3), teaching the melody (in F) in whichever way you prefer.
- 2. In small groups, students create 4-beat word chains of "nighttime things" ex: sunset, darkness, stars, moon
- 3. Speak word chains as B section of "All Through the Night" (2 word chains=1 B section) and play song melody as A section. (ABA)
- 4. Students improvise a melody in F-pentatonic to the rhythm of their word chain. Give plenty of time for students to "play" with these: alone, in small groups, and eventually for the class, possibly over the course of 2-3 lessons, depending on how much exposure they've had to improvisation.
- 5. Choose a student who has chosen to end on "sol" as the first improviser and one who has chosen to end on "do" as the second improviser.
- 6. Play song in ABA form as a class, with improvisation soloists on B section.
- 7. Allow several volunteers, or turn it into a rondo with several pairings of students improvising.
