Level: 3rd-5th Grade Objectives: Syncopation, triplets, modern band instruments Materials: Barred instruments, tubanos/drums, tambourine Video: Yellow Ostrich Performing "WHALE" live in NYC https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YON3PJNdnwE

## Process:

## Day 1

- 1. Discuss instruments in Yellow Ostrich's modern band: drumset, guitar, technology (looping). You can show students the live video of "WHALE".
- 2. Students clap the rhythm while singing each of the xylophone parts (background vocals in the original songs). Helpful hint: the rhythm is the same for all xylophone parts.
- 3. Transfer to xylophones and play with recording.

## Day 2/3

- 1. Discuss the role of syncopation in this song. Explore what it would sound like if it were not syncopated.
- 2. Learn the melody.
- 3. Review xylophone parts by singing and clapping each part.
- 4. Add tubano ostinato and tambourine. I just use the words, "Play low\_\_\_\_ go up, and" to help reinforce the tubano ostinato.
- 5. Put parts together and play with recording or perform without recording.

## Extensions:

- Display rhythms and introduce triplets and a dotted eighth with a sixteenth note.
- Divide class into groups and create movement/statues to go with each xylophone part. Recreate looping effect by layering in each group with their movement.
- For a contrasting B section, have students improvise over the xylophone and tubano parts.
